POWERPOINT PRESENTATION

Requirements

40 points Possible

- 1) Each slide must have a good layout; not be too busy, wordy, crowded etc. (3 points)
- 2) The presentation must use a theme or modified theme. (3 points)
- 3) The title slide must show the presenter's name. (3 points)
- 4) At least 4 clipart or digital images must be included during the slide show. (3 points)
- 5) Each slide must be readable from the back of the room. (3 points)
- 6) Each slide must have a title on it. (3 points)
- 7) The presentation must have a minimum of 8 slides but no more than 10 slides. (3 points)
- 8) At least two DIFFERENT research references or websites are required from internet or library, including photos if you use photos that are not created by you. No plagiarism! The final slide must include a bibliography in MLA style that lists all your sources. (3 points)
- 9) At least one GIF must be used. (3 points)
- 10) There must be at least 2 DIFFERENT slide transitions (Transitions happen when one slide moves to the next). (3 points)
- 11) Each presentation will be no longer than 6 minutes and not less than 4 minutes. This will be followed very strictly! (3 points)
- 12) You must incorporate at least 1 YouTube video clips into your presentation. No more than 2 clip is allowed per presentation and must be less than 2 minutes in length, with exceptions made only for those clips which the instructor deems critical to the presentation. (4 pts)

Presentation Requirements

<u>Presentation/Work</u> You will present an assigned article to the class and lead a discussion and critique of the issue(s) presented. PowerPoint, videos, dialogues/debates, etc. are welcome (anything goes as long as it is relevant to the issue being presented).

Your Tasks:

- present the article (40pts) Power point guide line on back
- explain the major points made by the author 20pts
- present the arguments given along with the evidence used as support 20pts
- link the points/arguments presented to the broader field of astronomy or space exploration 10pts
- critique the article, what is the weak point, where does the argument go wrong etc. 10pts

Approach this assignment professionally: prepare an outline or note cards that you will talk through. Do not just read several passages from the article or powerpoint (we can all read) -- provide analysis, put it in your own words, use examples etc.
